

Craft Fair Rules and Regulations

All applications must be postmarked no later than **March 31st**. Acceptance/Rejection notices will be sent out by April 30th. Please include a self-addressed, stamped envelope with your application.

1. Only those crafters who make and sell **THEIR OWN HAND-MADE CRAFTS MAY APPLY AND BE ACCEPTED**. It is a **JURIED SHOW**-- displays will be inspected at the Fair and rules will be enforced.
2. Only those crafters who have applied and been accepted by the Craft Fair Committee are allowed to sell their crafts. No tools, equipment or crafts made by someone else are to be sold.
3. All crafters are expected to be in their reserved space and available to the public during all hours that the show is open-rain or shine. This means **NO LATE ARRIVALS AND NO LEAVING EARLY**.
4. Fees for the spaces are determined by the width of space needed multiplied by \$8 per foot-fee is for all three days. If you use space in the Museum Pavilion, the space is approximately 10' x 8'.
5. The educational value of the events at the Museum is high on our list of priorities; therefore, we ask all crafters to try and demonstrate to the public the making of your product.
6. All crafters are responsible for their own set up and take down. The Museum does not supply chairs, tables, or electrical cords for demonstrating.
7. A \$30 fee (for all three days) will be charged for personal use of electrical hookups. There is no charge for electricity used for demonstration. A dumping station for RV's is available for a flat fee of \$10. Make reservations at the office for dumping.
8. There will be no camping on Craft Fair Grounds, except for those already demonstrating/displaying out of their campers, vans, etc. Places have been set aside for that use. There is a space on the Application Form to make that request.
9. Motorhomes, vans, etc., used in demonstrating/displaying crafts will be placed in special areas only.
10. **Pets are not allowed on the Fair Grounds at any time**. In the parking area, they must be kept on a leash and the owner must clean up after them.
